Win Carrick, truly a blast from the past (President, 1979), talked about his time in Mexico and his job as a tour guide. The Yale graduate with a Masters from Harvard has held six jobs and owned 16 residences in his life.

Currently living in Texas, he travels to the Oxford Hills every

summer to spend time with his in-laws. He is married to Stuart Goodwin's aunt, Janet. Win, well known for his dry and occasionally sardonic humor, treated us to a glimpse of his job as a house & garden tour bus guide in San Miguel, Mexico. He said there were only three reasons to live in San Miguel: to enjoy the altitude (6,300 feet - similar to Mt. Washington), to study Spanish or to buy property. Win had us imagine we were on a bus and he gave us the tour - much of it in Spanish. It was founded in 1542 and is a tourist destination for wealthy Mexico City residents. The community of nearly 70,000 includes nearly 12,000 foreign residents: retired Americans (70%) and Canadian (20%) residents. The remaining 10% come from 31 other countries. Thanks to Herb Strauss for inviting Win to speak. His Spanish was quite good (as far as any



of us could tell).
